# A Postfunctionalist Theory of Governance

**Oxford University Press** Regions within states have become important features of the political landscape. The authority of regions varies more than that of states, and many regions play a distinctive role that sets them apart from other regions in the same country. This book asks why the structure of governance within states has become multilevel. We compare individual regions and regional tiers in 81 countries to explain salient features of regional governance including the design of jurisdictions, the growth of differentiated governance, and the authority of regions. # Household Archaeology in Prehispanic Bolivia

But only now are we beginning to understand how these changes affected the lives of the residents at individual settlements. Presenting a "view from below" of Andean prehistory based on a remarkably extensive data set, Lukurmata is a rare case study of how prehispanic polities can be understood in new ways if prehistorians integrate the different lines of evidence available to them.
