The final chapter sets out the means of implementation. **An Exploration of the Role of the Public Health Nurse in the Formation of National Health Policy** The aim of this study is to gain an insight into Public Health Nurse (PHN) participation in national health policy formation, to explore their understanding and level of involvement in the process including opportunities afforded to them, or otherwise and how they perceive their involvement in the policy making process in the context of past, present and future potential within a changing health care system. In the context of a health care environment that is characterised by seismic reform and clearly focussed on a primary care agendas, defining the ever-expanding role of the PHN in health policymaking is of paramount importance. At a superficial level, it would appear that the role of the PHN is valued by policymakers and relatively important to the overall success of the health service. However, further analysis reveals that PHN's exert little if any influence on the policymaking process. This in turn has contributed to a policy-practice gap whereby the rhetoric of policy is difficult if not impossible for PHN's to execute in the absence of matching resources. To address the apparent lack of PHN participation in policymaking, this study proposes a model of effective pressure group activity to enable PHN's develop a framework for political activism in policymaking. Findings in this study suggest that the absence of a co-ordinated strategic approach to policymaking driven by Assistant Directors of Public Health Nursing (ADPHN)'s places PHN's in a position whereby they find it difficult to prioritise care while simultaneously participate in policymaking to ensure that their aspirations are actualised in policy directives. Hence, tensions clearly exist between government policy and public health nursing practice. There is a need for PHN's and policymakers to establish base-line criteria regarding what constitutes effective participation in policymaking as well as successful implementation of the policies for which they are charged with responsibility to implement. To attain this necessitates improved PHN-Government participation. On one hand, there is an onus on policymakers to ensure that all policymaking and implementation is open to the key stakeholders while on the other hand, there is a need for PHN's to take ownership and responsibility and value themselves in relation to policy issues and not merely be dictated to by policymakers whereby they are expected to implement policy in the absence of the required resources. There is a dire need for the role of the PHN to be defined, clarified and articulated to improve the functional capacity of the PHN at every level. The attraction of PHN's towards policymaking will require PHN's to be educated in this regard, to enable them to understand the political environment in which they work, to assess their strengths and limitations, validate that assessment and articulate a PHN vision for policymaking that is realistic, comprehensive, attainable and subject to constant re-valuation in the context of an ever-changing political, socio-economical and health care agendas. In this way PHN's will become established as a truly recognised group ensuring the inclusion of their unique perspectives in government policy and that will ensure its sustainability and thus enable PHN's to deliver a high quality of care and actively participate in building a quality driven health care system. The influence that any particular group has in the policymaking process depends on a number of factors. Evidence suggests that there is a lack of will on the part of PHN's to engage in anything that appears political. Getting more PHN's and their organizations involved in the policymaking process poses challenges for the policymakers and for PHN's alike. Recommendations: As with all qualitative research, the generalization of results is limited. Nevertheless, a number of recurring themes are evident. This research calls for the development of the role of the Assistant Directors of Public Health Nursing to encompass a proactive leadership and supportive role to enable PHN's to contribute to the policymaking process in health care. There is a need for the development of a structured framework for PHN participation in policymaking at every level to enable the views of PHN's to be heard. At a functional level, there is a need to address the excessive workloads imposed on PHN's arising out of policy directives by the adequate recruitment of suitably trained staff and the provision of appropriate resources. As a group, PHN's need to become united at a collective level and capitalise on the political potential available to them particularly through trade unions and the Institute of Community Health Nursing.
