In international business, agency problems may exist between managers, owners, staff, and other stakeholders who come from different cultures. As international business involves people from different cultures, every business function including managing a workforce, marketing output, and dealing with regulators, has the potential to involve cross-cultural problems (Zineldin 2007).
