### RACE AND CONTENTION IN TWENTY-FIRST CENTURY U.S. MEDIA

*Routledge* This volume explores and clarifies the complex intersection of race and media in the contemporary United States. Due to the changing dynamics of how racial politics are played out in the contemporary US (as seen with debates of the "post-racial" society), as well as the changing dynamics of the media itself ("new vs. old" media debates), an interrogation of the role of the media and its various institutions within this area of social inquiry is necessary. ### PAULINE HOPKINS AND ADVOCACY JOURNALISM

Xlibris Corporation *In the 1905 letter to William Monroe Trotter, Pauline Hopkins wrote that she lost the editorship of the Colored American Magazine because she "refused partisan lines" and "pursued an independent course." This book focuses on how her editorship promoted an advocacy journalism that sought to abolish Jim Crow. The work of the magazine under her editorship "pursued an independent course" because it included in-depth biographical sketches of those whose lives she, before many, deemed important to know, such as Toussaint L'Ouverture and Harriet Tubman. Hopkins "pursued an independent course" also as a novelist, particularly in her first novel *Contending Forces*, a work unique for a narrator that tried to, in Hopkins's words, "raise the stigma of degradation from my race." Her following three novels were serialized in the *Colored American Magazine*. Her 1901 novel *Hagar's Daughter* is about the attempt of two generations to assimilate within the Washingtonian elite, her 1902 novel *Winona* exposes the effect of Washington's 1850 Fugitive Slave Law on enslaved children, and her 1903 novel *Of One Blood* explores what it means for an individual socialized in the West to, in Hopkins's words, "curse the bond of the white race." In Dr. Rhone Fraser's, close reading of her fiction, he looks at how her protagonists in each novel pursue "an independent course" and in his final chapter he compares her essential work to Black journalists of the twenty first century who, like her, "refused partisan lines" and "pursued an independent course." Pauline Hopkins's work was not just the work of a typical journalist, but the work of an advocate.*

### THE TERRIBLE FOURS

When Ishmael Reed wrote *The Terrible Twos* about the American infantile need for instant gratification, he could not have realized that during the week of June 29, 2020, journalist Nicole Wallace would be referring to a president as a "toddlers." Part science fiction, part Washington Novel and part Christmas Novel, *The Terrible Fours* follows *The Terrible Twos* (1982) and *The Terrible Threes* (1989). Some characters have been dropped and some of the principals are back. St. Nicholas is here, but his sidekick Black Peter, who appeared in *The Terrible Twos*, has been shelved to the Epilog. In *The Terrible Threes*, former president Dean Clift, who was removed from office after a bizarre television address, disappeared with his entourage while en route to resume his presidency after Supreme Court justice, Nola Payne, casts the vote that declared his removal from office under the 25th Amendment unconstitutional. Televangelist Clement-Jones still runs the White House and continues to humiliate his hand-picked president Jesse Hatch whom he is blackmailing. "The Rapture," that Jones and figurehead president Jesse Hatch promised, hasn't arrived. Realizing that the Catholic Church has been losing

## THE SATIRE OF ISHMAEL REED

### FROM NON-STANDARD SEXUALITY TO ARGUMENTATION

---

Masarykova univerzita Tato kniha se zaměřuje na tvorbu afroamerického spisovatele Ishmaela Reeda a sleduje, jak se napříč jeho padesátiletou románovou tvorbou proměňuje způsob, jímž autor uplatňuje satiru. Přestože je každý Reedův román originálním knižním počinem, v uplatnění satiry lze najít jisté pravidelnosti a vývojové tendence. Zatímco v Reedově rané satirě převládá společenská kritika založená na zobrazení nestandardní sexuality, v jeho současnější satirě (címž je označována autorova románová tvorba od roku 1993 dále) dominuje společenská kritika založená na argumentaci. Uvedené mody satiry jsou v knize dále propojeny se dvěma druhy amerického rasismu, s rasismem zjevným a skrytým. Kniha dokládá, že spolu s tím, jak se zjevný rasismus stal v americkém společenském diskurzu nepřipustným a byl nahrazen rasismem skrytým, aktualizoval Ishmael Reed svoji satiru, aby i nadále zůstala efektivním modelem společenské kritiky. Kniha je určena pro čtenáře z řad odborné i širší veřejnosti, kteří mají zájem o tvorbu Ishmaela Reeda i afroamerickou literaturu obecně. Inspirativní může být i pro ty, jež se zajímají o žánr satiry a její vývoj.

#### A WALK IN OAKLAND

---

Crown Oakland is a blues city, brawling and husky . . . Often overshadowed by San Francisco, its twinkling sister city across the Bay, Oakland is itself an American wonder. The city is surrounded by and filled with natural beauty—mountains and hills and lakes and a bay—and architecture that mirrors its history as a Spanish mission, Gold Rush outpost, and home of the West's most devious robber barons. It's also a city of artists and blue-collar workers, the birthplace of the Black Panthers, neighbor to Berkeley, and home to a vibrant and volatile stew of immigrants and refugees. ### GOING TOO FAR

#### ESSAYS ABOUT AMERICA'S NERVOUS BREAKDOWN

---

When an American critic complained that with his new novel, "Juice!", Ishmael Reed had gone "too far," he didn't realize how far Reed had gone. All the way to Canada! Just as the fugitive slaves, who'd found a home in Canada, were able to challenge the prevailing attitude in the America that the slaves were well off under the management of merciful masters, from Canada, where *Going Too Far* is published, Ishmael Reed challenges the widespread opinion that racism is no longer a factor in American life. In fact, according to Reed, in some ways, the United States very much resembles the country of the 1850's. The representations of blacks in popular culture are throwbacks to the days of minstrelsy. Politicians are raising stereotypes about blacks reminiscent of those that the fugitive slaves found it necessary to combat: that they are lazy and dependent and need people to manage them. Reaction to some of the essays in *Going Too Far* has been ferocious. Joan Walsh of Salon.com, called his criticism of white progressives, "pernicious." Laura Miller of The New York Times called his essay on Mark Twain, "rowdy." Sapphire, the author of *Push* from which the movie *Precious* was adapted, said that his criticism of the movie meant that he was "mentally ill." Ishmael Reed answers by paraphrasing Harry Truman, whose Civil Rights record is examined in this book. He says, "I'm not any of those things. I just tell the truth and it looks as though I'm 'rowdy,' 'pernicious,' and 'mentally ill.'"

After *The Complete Muhammad Ali*, recognized by many as the "truly definitive book" on the champion, Ishmael Reed is back with another exciting book of essays that will stir up debate in the United States and abroad.
