Supported by a vast collection of archival material—photographs, newspaper clippings, and illustrations—Julie M. Fenster captures a group most Americans know nothing about: the dreamers and thinkers who found the need for a product, be it practical or fanciful, and saw it through to its creation. The book is an entirely fresh and fascinating examination of innovation as an innate force, inspiring unsung people to do magnificent things. A grateful public generally lauded their efforts, but when they turned their attention to Arkansas's Buffalo River, the vocal opposition their proposed projects generated dumbfounded them. Never before had anyone challenged the Corps's assumption that damming a river was an improvement.
